

CHING-CHI CHEN

Professor and Associate Dean Graduate School of Library and Information Science Simmons College Boston, Massachussetts



Ching-chih Chen is an internationally known educator, research, author and consultant, specializing in the application of new technologies to libraries and information centers. These technologies include optical technologies, microcomputers, numeric and bibliographic and image databases, operations research, quantitative measurement, informations need assessment, zero-based budgeting, and scientific/technical and medical literature.

She has authored twelve books, edited five others, contributed articles to over fifty scholarly journals, served on numerous conference and publications boards, and delivered over twenty keynote speeches around the world. She is the founder and editor-in-chief of Microcomputers for Information Management, a quarterly journal serving libraries and information centers in over forty countries. In addition, she was the Chief Conference Organizer of the very successful First Pacific Conference on New Information Technology, Bangkok, Thailand, June 1987.

Professor Chen has served on numerous committees and governing boards, including those of the American Society for Information Science and the American Association for the Advancement of Science. She is currently a Councillor-at-Large of the American Library Association.

Dr. Chen was elected a Fellow of the American Association for the
Advancement of Science in 1985. Among her other numerous awards and honors
is the 1983 Outstanding Information Science Teacher Award from the American
Society for Information Science.
